

"About Re-thinking/Reuse. Successful Cases in Religious Heritage" is a peer-learning event dedicated to the exchange of good practices among project partners and stakeholders working on the rethinking and reuse of religious heritage across Europe. More than a traditional seminar, it is conceived as a structured space for dialogue, comparison, and mutual learning based on concrete experiences.

The event brings together institutional representatives, practitioners, and policy experts to present successful cases of transformation and revitalisation of former religious buildings, showing how reuse can act as a lever for territorial development, social innovation, and cultural programming. At the same time, particular attention is paid to respecting the historical, architectural, and symbolic values of these sites, fully acknowledging their specific typologies and spatial configurations.

Reuse is therefore approached as a knowledge-based process: not every function is suitable for every building, and informed decision-making is the essential starting point for any sustainable intervention. By sharing methodologies, governance models, and practical solutions, the event aims to strengthen the partners' capacity to design context-sensitive reuse strategies that preserve identity while ensuring long-term viability.
